

Route

- 1** Leave the Tourist office passing in front of the Wine house and the gate of the church, and take the street on your right up to the roundabout.
- 2** At the first roundabout, continue straight on towards Saint Christophe.
- 3** At the second roundabout, turn right towards Saint Christophe (follow the sign St-Emilion sud).
- 4** At the junction, continue straight on and let St-Emilion Sud on your right. Ride along Château Trottevieille.
- 5** Take the narrow road on your left at the sign Château Haut-Sarpe and ride towards the wind mill and the Château de Haut-Sarpe.
- 6** Leave the hamlet Haut-Sarpe and go back to road D243. At the «give way» sign, take D243 road on your left towards Saint Christophe.
- 7** At the entrance of St-Christophe, at the roundabout, take the hairpin turn on your right towards the townhall (mairie). Leave the village going up.
- 8** Go up and at the crossroads after the sign Laroque-Lappelletrie, turn left towards Château Laroque.
- 9** Pass along the iron gate of Château Laroque and continue straight on.
- 10** Ride along the low wall of Château Laroque up to the crossroads and turn right. Go down the slope.
- 11** In the slope, after the houses on your right, turn left towards the church of St-Hippolyte.
- 12** And turn immediately right towards Château de Ferrand.
- 13** Ride the tree-lined driveway up to the iron gate of Château de Ferrand. Then continue up to the church of St-Hippolyte.
- 14** In front of the church, you can go down the path to visit the grottoes of Château de Ferrand or continue straight on.

- 15** Take the first road on your left after the church towards St-Christophe.
- 16** Next to Château Destieu, continue straight on up to Château Boutisse.
- 17** At the stop, beware of the traffic and take road D243 on your right.
- 18** Go down the slope up to the crossroads of St-Etienne (on your right) and go up the hill straight on (hang in there) towards de St-Genès.
- 19** At the end of the straight line, turn right near the bus stop towards Château de Pressac.
- 20** Go to Château de Pressac and admire the view over Dordogne valley. Then continue going down towards Château Faugères.
- 21** Pass in front of the modern cellar of Château Faugères and continue going down.
- 22** At the bottom of the descent, turn right.
- 23** At the «give way» sign, turn right towards Château Rocher and St-Etienne-de-Lisse.
- 24** Cross the village of St-Etienne-de-Lisse and continue straight on towards St-Laurent-des-Combes.
- 25** Cross St-Laurent-des-Combes and continue straight on towards St-Emilion.
- 26** Pass in front of Château Pavie situated on your right and continue straight on up to La Gaffelière.
- 27** In La Gaffelière, turn right and go up to the village of St-Emilion.
- 28** At the bottom of the village, go up in «rue Guadet», the main paved street on your right.
- 29** At the top of «rue Guadet», turn left near Martin wine shop in «rue du clocher» and reach the Tourist office.



Route of the remarkable architectures



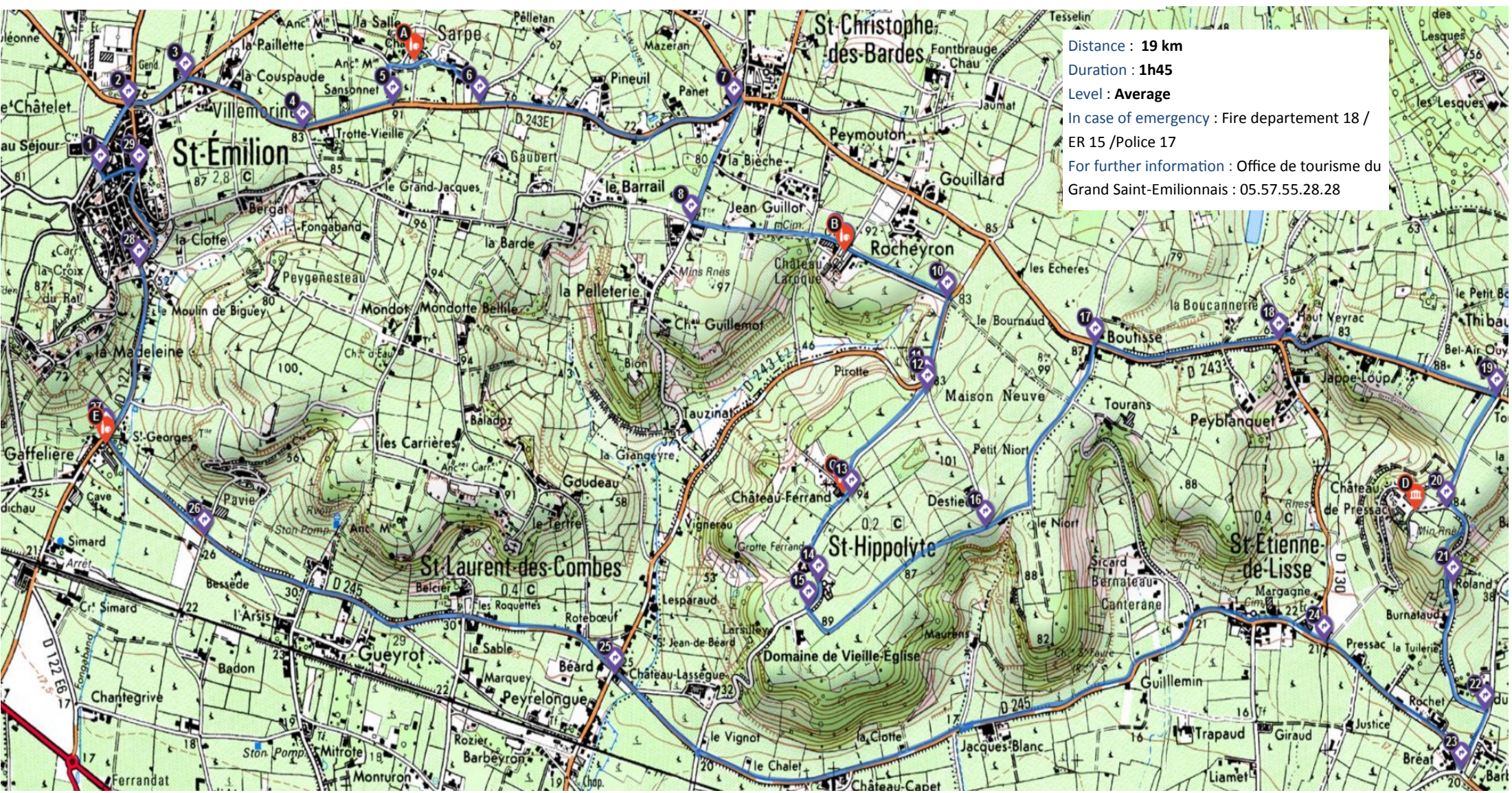
Description
